Fundamental Critical Care Support Obstetrics Course Simulation Schedule

DAY 1

AUGUST 27, 2026

Participants will be divided into different groups to rotate through each station.

GROUPS: Red, Green, Blue, Black, Orange, Purple

STATIONS: Ai, Aii, B, C

The goal of simulation is to create a safe, realistic learning environment where healthcare providers can practice and improve care to patients and newborns without risk to real patients.

DURATION: 3.0 hours

EACH STATION: 50 minutes then 10 minutes to rotate

TOTAL PARTICIPANTS: 100 people/group, 12-17 people/station

STATION	GOALS AND OBJECTIVES
Hypertension/Eclampsia Red group will start here	Review escalation and management for patients with hypertensive emergency and eclampsia
Neonatal Resuscitation (NRP) Green group will start here	Practice neonatal resuscitation for the first 5 minutes after delivery
Sepsis (Two stations) Blue group and Orange group will start here	Review identification, escalation, team huddle, and multidisciplinary management for sepsis in pregnancy
Postpartum Hemorrhage (PPH) and Massive Transfusion Protocol (MTP) (Two stations) Black group and Purple group will start here	- Identify and manage PPH that leads to MTP - Review MTP activation, choreography, and monitoring

Participants will be divided into different groups to rotate through each station.

GROUPS: Red, Green, Blue, Black, Orange, Purple, Pink, Yellow, Light Blue, Salmon

STATIONS: A, B, C

The goal of simulation is to create a safe, realistic learning environment where healthcare providers can practice and improve care to patients and newborns without risk to real patients.

DURATION: 3.0 hours

EACH STATION: 50 minutes then 10 minutes to rotate

TOTAL PARTICIPANTS: 100 people/group, 10-12 people/station

STATION	GOALS AND OBJECTIVES
Point of Care Ultrasound (POCUS) (Four stations) Red, Green, Blue, Black will start here	Review point of care ultrasound for cardiac, pulmonary and abdominal evaluation
Maternal Cardiac Arrest (MCA) (Two stations) Light Blue, Salmon will start here	Review the first five minutes of cardiac arrest, high quality CPR, early defibrillation for shockable rhythm and team communication strategies
Airway management (Four stations) Orange, Purple, Pink, Yellow will start here	Review common oxygen delivery methods, use of Bipap/HFNC and basic of mechanical ventilation/ventilator set up
